- 26.MIKE: 对,对,对,谢谢叔叔、阿姨对我照顾。对了,还有你,小明。
- 27.小明爸:哈哈,看,MIKE 跟个小大人似的。
- 28.MIKE 妈: 嗯,好茶,好茶。这是我喝过的最好的龙井茶。
- 29.小明爸:哈哈,您知道吗,中国古代的诗人有的把龙井称为"黄金芽",可见龙井茶有多受人们欢迎。
- 30.小明:哎呀,我还没来得及品,就已经喝完了。

- 9. MIKE's Mom: What a beautiful teahouse, this table is very interesting.
- 10.Xiao Ming's mom: Haha, this is called an eight immortals table.
- 11.Xiao Ming's Dad: You speak Chinese really well, it's not your first visit to China, is it?
- 12.MIKE's mom: No. I've worked for a few years in Shanghai before, but it's my first visit to Beijing.
- 13. Xiao Ming's mom: This is a great opportunity for MIKE and Xiao Ming to show you around.

- 15.Xiao Ming's Dad: Have a look, what sort of tea would you like?
- 16.MIKE's mom: There are so many types of tea, I don't know which one to order.
- 17.MIKE: Yes, uncle, why don't you and auntie order.
- 18.Xiao Ming's mom: How about you recommend one?
- 19. Waiter: We have very good Dragon Well Tea, the leaves are this year's vintage.
- 20. Xiao Ming's mom: OK, make us a pot of Dragon Well Tea.
- 21.MIKE: Uncle, auntie, I always tell my mom that you're really nice to me and that I'm having a good time in Beijing. So now that mom's here in Beijing, she says she has to thank you in person.
- 22.MIKE's mom: Yes, that's right.
- 23. Xiao Ming's mom: You don't have to be so polite with us. Ever since MIKE's been here, Xiao Ming's had a close pal. They get along so well.
- 24.Xiao Ming: Yes, MIKE and I are good buddies, nobody can keep us apart.
- 25.MIKE's mom: Come on, MIKE, let's make a toast to uncle and auntie.
- 26.MIKE: Yes, that's right, thanks uncle and auntie for looking after me. Oh right, and you too, Xiao Ming.
- 27. Xiao Ming's Dad: Haha, look, MIKE's talking just like a grown-up.
- 28.MIKE's mom: Mmm, this tea is very good. It's the best Dragon Well Tea I've had.
- 29.Xiao Ming's Dad: Haha, do you know that some ancient Chinese poets called Dragon Well Tea "sprouts of gold", that's how loved this tea is.
